



## Finima Nature Park Week 17 Report

**Highlights:** Perimeter, anti-poaching patrol and biological monitoring was conducted round the park twice during the week (Thursday and Saturday), observations were noted with no arrest made. Birds, Mona monkeys, snakes, insects among many other animals were sighted.

**Outreach & Engagement:** There was no school visit under this reporting period as all the schools are on vacation.

**Ecotourism**: Individuals, families and friends visited the Park during the week and all visitors were properly conducted round the Park with satisfactory nature interpretation.

**Reforestation program:** 300 *Rhizophora mangle* (red mangroves) were planted along the seacoast in an effort to contain the costal encroachment into the Park. Also, some of the previously planted seedlings were weeded and those that could not survive were replaced with *Cleistopholis patens* (Salt and oil tree) and *Rhizophora mangle* (red mangrove) along Ngalanga and the seacoast respectively.

**Tidiness & Cleanliness**: Tidiness of the boardwalk and other Park facilities were carried out during this reporting week i.e. sweeping of the trail, clearing and cutting of tree branches that fell along the board walk.
