NATURE CONSERVATION

Nature is the phenomena of the physical world collectively, including plants, animals, the landscape, and other features and products of the earth, as opposed to humans or human creations. It underpins our economy, our society, indeed our very existence. Our forests, rivers, oceans, and soils provide us with the food we eat, the air we breathe, the water we irrigate our crops with. We also rely on them for numerous other goods and services we depend on for our health, happiness, and prosperity.

Conservation is a careful preservation, protection, and planned management of a natural resource to prevent exploitation or destruction. It is also the care and protection of these resources so that they can persist for future generations. It includes maintaining the diversity of species, genes, and ecosystems, as well as functions of the environment, such as nutrient cycling.

Nature conservation is the moral philosophy and conservation movement focused on protecting species from extinction, maintaining and restoring habitats, enhancing ecosystem services, and protecting biological diversity.

A range of values underlies conservation, which can be guided by biocentrism, anthropocentrism, ecocentrism, and sentientism. There has recently been a movement towards evidence-based conservation which calls for greater use of scientific evidence to improve the effectiveness of conservation efforts. As of 2018, 15% of land and 7.3% of the oceans were protected. Many environmentalists set a target of protecting 30% of land and marine territory by 2030.

The Bird Watching Activity for the third quarter of the year was organized on the first Saturdays of the months of July, August, and September. Thirty people including members of the formed “Finima Nature Park Bird Club” and other nature enthusiasts were in attendance. Birds sighted were Pied Crow, Woodland Kingfisher, Black kite, Western Reef Heron, and Common Sand Piper, Whimbrel (a new migrated bird) among others. These birds were sighted at Worker’s Camp, behind RA (Residential Area) and the migrated bird was sighted at the RA Beach.

The highlight of the birdwatch conducted this quarter was the sighting of the migratory water birds.

“Let us plant more trees, let us use eco-friendly products to save this planet, save the OZONE.... Wishing a very Happy World Ozone Day.”



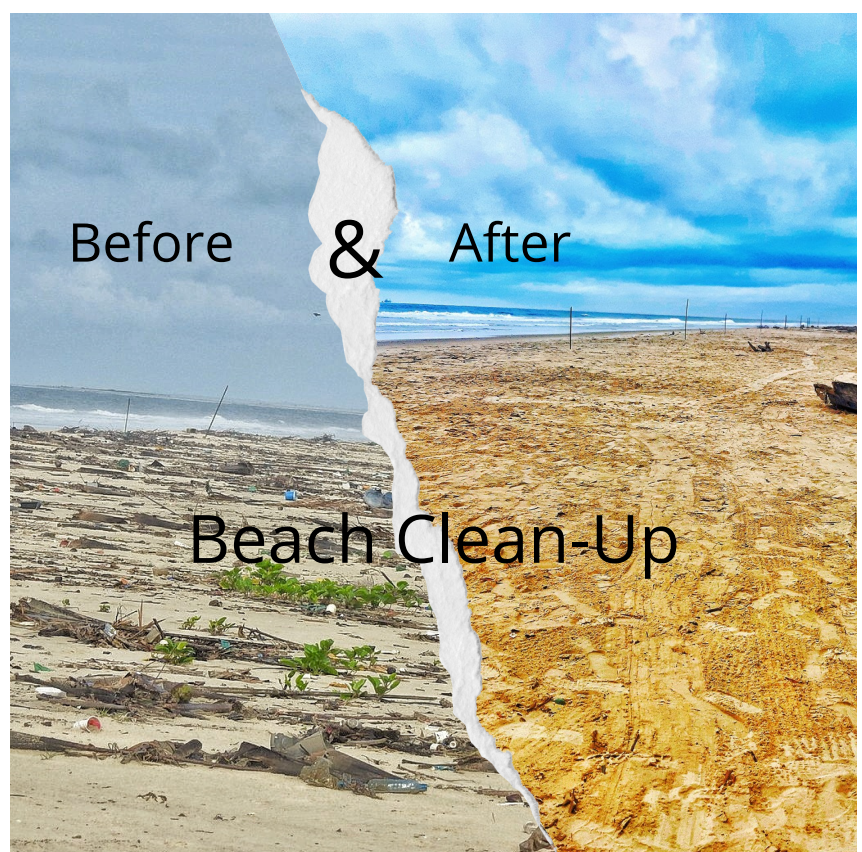


WORLD OZONE DAY PROPER

On Saturday, 18th September, 2021, the Finima Nature Park staff, Nigeria Liquefied Natural Gas (NLNG) HSE team, National Youth Service Corps (NYSC) members, Primary and Secondary school students from various schools and other guest who were at attendance centred the day's event on beach clean-up and tree planting at the sea shores in commemoration of the World Ozone Day, 100 trees were planted at the sea shore to prevent erosion, protect the coastal lines of the beach and to help the environment in absorbing the carbons.

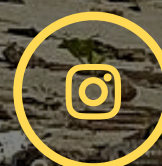
