INTRODUCTION

Biodiversity (from "biological diversity") refers to the variety of life on Earth at all its levels and all its interactions, starting with genes, then individual species, then communities of creatures and finally the entire ecosystems, such as forests or coral reefs, where life interplays with the physical environment, and can encompass the evolutionary, ecological, and cultural processes that sustain life. It is the most complex feature of our planet and it is the most vital; without biodiversity, there is no future for humanity.

Conservation is a planned management of a natural resource to prevent exploitation, destruction and ensure efficient use of resources. It is also the care and protection of these resources so that they can persist for future generations.

Biodiversity conservation refers to the protection, upliftment and management of biodiversity in order to derive sustainable benefits for present and future generations. The major aims of biodiversity conservation are: preserve the diversity of species, sustain utilization of species and ecosystem and maintain life-supporting systems and essential ecological processes

Biodiversity can be conserved in two ways: Exsitu conservation and In-situ conservation.

In-situ conservation of biodiversity is the conservation of species within their natural habitat. In this method, the natural ecosystem is maintained and protected.

Finima Nature Park, Bonny practices in-situ conservation whereby the different species of animals are allowed to freely range their natural habitat. This is done because it is a convenient method of conserving biodiversity and cost-effective. A large number of living organisms can be conserved simultaneously and since the organisms are in a natural ecosystem, they can evolve better and can easily adjust to different environmental conditions.

World Habitat Day is celebrated annually every first Monday of October. The event focuses on the state of human settlements and on the basic right of all towards adequate shelter. It also aims to remind people that they are responsible for the habitat of future generations.

The theme for this year's World Habitat Day is "ACCELERATING URBAN ACTION FOR A CARBON-FREE WORLD". In commemoration of the World Habitat Day 2021, a community climate sensitization march was organized on the 4th October 2021 with tree planting exercise within the community to mark the event with an attendance of 120 people which comprises NYSC members, pupils, and students of 11 schools on the island with their coordinators and were led by Finima Nature Park outreach team.

World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD) is an awareness-raising campaign highlighting the need for the conservation of migratory birds and their habitats.

It aims to draw attention to the threats faced by migratory birds, their ecological importance, and the need for international cooperation to conserve them. It was celebrated on the 9th of October, 2021 with bird watching activity which was attended by Finima Nature Park Bird Club and other nature enthusiast. Some of the birds sighted were Pied Crow, Wood and King Fisher, Black kite, Senegal Thick-knee, Whimbrel and Common House Martin amongst others.









CONSERVATION CLUB ACTIVITIES

Conservation club activities was carried out in 64 schools, this term topic centered on OZONE LAYER DEPLETION. The causes, effects and possible solutions were taught in all schools which was interactive and impactful.

Causes of Ozone Layer Depletion

The main causes of ozone layer depletion are:

1.Chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs): These are released by solvents, spray aerosols, pesticides, refrigerators, drycleaning agents and air-conditioners.

2. Halons: They are released by fire-extinguishers

Effects of Ozone Layer Depletion

The depletion of the ozone layer has harmful effects on the human health, animals, environment and marine life, which are:

- 1.Skin cancer
- 2. Eye cataracts or blindness
- 3.Sunburns
- 4. Plant retardation
- 5.Quick ageing

Preventions of Ozone Layer Depletion

Every individual should also take steps to prevent the depletion of the ozone layer. One should avoid using pesticides and shift to natural methods to get rid of pests instead of using chemicals. The vehicles emit a large amount of greenhouse gases that lead to ozone depletion. Therefore, the use of vehicles should be minimized as much as possible. Most of the cleaning products have chemicals that affect the ozone layer. We should substitute that with eco-friendly products. Maintain air conditioners, as their malfunctions cause CFC to escape into the atmosphere.





REFORESTATION

As part of the solutions to climate change and biodiversity conservation, reforestation is very important. Finima Nature Park through conservation clubs have established Eco gardens in some of the schools and still counting. 12,324 mangroves and 900 coconut seedlings were planted along the sea shore and at various communities on the Island. Also, 10,000 fruit trees were planted in 30 communities on the Island.


